




4. Were you able to network with the right people and further your music career?

4.) What year did you start? According to my family I've been at it since like 13, but for me I'm going to say 2016. That's when I felt comfortable enough to say "wow, i can do this forever". I had my first show that year as well and it just solidified in my mind that this is what I was put here for.

art or talent as a career choice? My parents were in the industry back in the 90s and they were heavy in the game. Like performing at FreakNik and being invited to the first annual Rap awards. They were locked in and was really one of if not the first independent label out of Florida to receive major distribution for their artist. They were directly plugged into the record stores, they knew radio hosts by name, they would be in the offices of buildings like Def Jam and Epic Records and more.

We've always had a room or location inside of whatever home we lived in that was dedicated to the studio. I would sit in the sessions with them and see the recording take place. Watch the process from writing on that pad, recording, scratching out and rewriting, recording and then seeing it from start to finish. Like the promo runs, the posters, the packets being delivered to radio, the shows.

Even one of my older sisters and her friend's were dancers for the artist under my parents label. So seeing that take place, I was like, okay I can do that. Then I would sneak in the studio and play with pro tools and the different session files to learn how to use it. I just know how much it touched me when I was growing up and even now, and I just ... I'm not sure. I want to continue to pass on the blessing of music and hip hop for those who have the passion for it. It's a different space than it used to be, but I think that works in my favor.

6.) What are your top five artists or idols' inspirations? Oh wow, that's a tough one, I listen to so many different artists so it's insane to have just a top 5. If i were to ever put a name on it i would do it like this - krs 1 and big daddy cane them, eminem and aftermath records, lil wayne and cash money/young money records, and a special spot for Nicki Minaj. Something about the underdog always makes me smile and when you look at her career, whether you agree with her or not, you can not deny the talent, skill, and impact she has had on the industry... well actually the world would probably be more accurate.



1.) Where are you from?
Born in Dallas Texas. Raised from age 8 in Tyler, Texas


2.) How different is it to come up in a Christian background to see the world now? Coming up Christian is no different than anything else in my opinion. Even without the ten commandments and hundreds of thou shalt not everyone has their own standards and beliefs regardless of how stern or lax. In my home Christian education was more about learning the characteristics of God. My mom was more into how God connected to everything rather than a set a rules. She bought encyclopedias and books on aliens and UFO 's and different spiritual practices around the world. She encouraged learning especially of ancient traditions that were passed down through our immediate bloodline. In addition to being a Christian. She is a geneologist and historian as well as an engineer so she always challenged us to look beyond our present circumstances for answers. I think the Christian education was important to her for a foundation and example but there were never limitations on learning. As far as my world view from a Christian point of view is feed my sheep. My favorite Bible verse is ask and I'll give the nations to you for an inheritance, so my outreach is world wide and not limited to a religion or a practice or any law of man.

3.) How did you get interested in acting in plays?
As a child I loved to play with dolls and I'd have them acting out scenes from TV shows that I watched. I took
Theater as an elective in middle school and found that I had a talent for the overly dramatic.

In high school I did my first real play as part of the chorus in Charlotte's Webb. My first starring role was as Nana in The Velveteen Rabbit. It sparked a lil controversy because I was one of the only black actors in the play and was given the role of a servant. I also played the role with strong references to my own grand mother Mama Della so the casting read as slightly racist in the black community thinking I had been directed in the portrayal or type cast. After that I began competing in forensic competitions in dramatic interpretation and poetry. As a troop our One Act Play placed high enough in competition season to earn me a letter the art for sound technician. Even the I didn't have an acting role, our Director made sure that our entire troop was able to participate to make the play as strong as it was to rank in our district. High School theater led to an Associate of Arts degree on Speech/Theater and more competition success.

- 4.) Can you tell us what made you interested in becoming a Cosmetology instructor & a Caseworker? I always loved doing hair and makeup so it was a natural progression. By 12 th grade I was so ready to get out of high school that I enrolled in the cosmetology program which meant I was able to spend half the day off campus and not have to ride the bus to school. Cosmetology was also a great fall back when I got tired of being in college studying journalism and radio TV broadcasting at University of Texas Arlington. Sociology was my minor and at the time the first desert storm was had hit and their was a big shift in focus on humanitarianism. I just started seeing the life of an actor as less important and sort of a frivolous undertaking.
- 5.) To you is there any difference with being a Disability Advocate, Mental health worker? No. They are the same to me. Either way there's an unmet need and healing needs to take place.
- 6.) What Keeps you inspired as an entrepreneur? The inspiration comes from doing what I love and not being too focused on the financial part. It's not so much as building a business it's more about fulfilling the mission of healing and connecting people to resources.







3. People are saying that SXSW has changed tremendously post Covid. What are your opinions on this change? I don't know from before since my first time at South By was during Covid so it was really different from what I've got to see. This year felt a lot bigger, very well organized, more international acts compared to last time I came, it's beautiful to see! SXSW is doing its thing right and hopefully they could expand and do it in more countries. It would be insane to give the opportunity to those who can't go to the States & Australia.

4. Were you able to network with the right people and further your music career? Yes I was, I met a lot of interesting and talented artists and producers from all around too, not just Americans and I'm looking forward to working with them to test new waters. I feel like it will give a boost to my music career, it's all about connecting the dots and expanding into new territory!

5. What is your advice to Artists attending big Festivals like SXSW? Do not hold off, do not be shy, go talk to everyone and put yourself out there! That's the whole point of this festival, to connect and work! Everyone is there for that and the energy is right there! My mentality and work ethic definitely has changed for the better when I came back to Montreal.






