Heaven is a state of mind and if you can visualize your version of heaven, you can visualize the paths to get to it as well. Live free and dream large luv'd one. Peace



In my point of view, the difference between an artist and an entrepreneur is defining the fine line between business & creative endeavor and/or motive. While both share common traits, an artist is, at heart, committed to indulging deeply into their creation as a priority over all potential material or external benefits. Whereas, an entrepreneur on the other hand, is commonly an idea associated with the priority of being very structural behind one or more endeavors intended to have a desired outcome such as a business.

I started making music with intent in 2010 during my freshman year of high school. However, I was born into a very musically inclined family and had always been fascinated with its creation from an early age. Prior to then, my introduction to music was writing short horror stories as well as spoken word.

2.) What inspires your view of art?

Art is something we look back on over the years to show us where we've been. What our opinions and feelings were at the time, and that, sometimes, can offer us insight into the future. I think part of that comes from the timelessness of true art. True art to me, is something you can experience fully, regardless of when it was created. Obviously, there are technological considerations to be made here, but there's a reason we still view Picasso, or Beethoven, or The Beatles as the high artists they were. No one can take it away from them, they're timeless. I really do try and carry that philosophy into my own art.

Not expecting anyone to talk about me in the same light as Picasso, but maybe the Beatles hehe. There have been countless times my old lyrics carry new meaning to me in my life after time passes, but the art didn't change, just my views and opinions on it. 7.) What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?



I hit every plateau imaginable, but I just kept pushing through, never being satisfied and just always going forward.

I still do that to this day, and it works. If you want to pursue any form of art, you just have to meet like minded people and grow together, and just never quit. It isn't easy, but the more work you put in, the easier it gets, and the more doors open up. Also, just be yourself as an artist. Another Cliché, but when I first started, I tried to have my own "act" or "schtick." 
5.) As a director, who or what inspires your vision?

After the pandemic, I went through a discovery period where I tried a bunch of different things (sketch comedy, acting, improv, open mics) which eventually led me to the idea of pursuing music again, this time as the pop diva I'd always dreamed I could be. I met Alan at their drag show and heard their original music, asked if they would be interested in producing songs for me, and the rest is history.

5.) What made you want to pursue your art or talent as a career choice?

I want to share my passion with as many people as possible! Art is all about human connection, and I never feel more connected than when I'm singing and dancing my heart out onstage. All the behind the scenes shadow work that goes into getting the music out there to the people can be so draining, but those electrifying moments when total strangers fully understand me make it all worthwhile.

6.) What are your top five artists or idols inspiration?

The top artists that inspire me are Lady Gaga, ABBA, Trixie Mattel, Beyoncé (duh), My Chemical Romance, and most recently Chappell Roan!

1.) Where are you from?

I'm from Northeast Washington DC. I grew up all around the H Street corridor. I have family around the DC area and I went to school in Norfolk so I also spent time in MD and southern VA.

2.) What inspires your view of art?

My personal experiences usually inspires what I do artistically. I'm a big fan of artists such as Scarface, Prodigy, DMX, Stevie Wonder, and Prince and one thing that they all do really well is create art that draws from life experiences and provides commentary on those experiences. What's also inspiring is creating something that speaks to my mindset and emotions, I really value art that has spiritual, deep, and warm feelings and undertones so I do my best to create pieces that are healing and soothing in some sort of way.

3.) From your point of view, what is the difference between being an artist and entrepreneur?

An artist usually deals with the creation of art and all the thoughts, feelings and actions that go into creating an artistic piece or project.

An entrepreneur is someone that takes that piece or project and tries to figure out the best ways to represent that art in a business sense to an audience. Ultimately the entrepreneurship is sustaining a business or way of living with art.

4.) What year did you start?

I started writing poetry and songwriting in 3rd grade and I would do it for fun over the years. It wasn't until about 2014 when I started to formally pursue a career as a musician. I started as a DJ because I didn't feel as though I could really make it as a recording artist or instrumentalist, but over time I gave it a try, learned from other experienced artists and discovered that I actually had great potential so I started recording my own songs and practicing guitar and keyboard. I ended up sticking with DJing, songwriting, producing, and keyboard and it has been really fulfilling for me. It's like they're all different branches of the same tree.

5.) What made you want to pursue your art or talent as a career choice?

I was just curious at first, and I really didn't think I was savvy or skilled enough to even learn music but as I wrote more songs, produced more songs, and played more DJ gigs people were responding very well.

I eventually became confident enough to venture out and collaborate with promoters and artists on events and projects. After I kept seeing good results from my attempts I decided to record my first project. And although it wasn't a big hit it really inspired me to keep trying, which over time turned into a respectable career.


7.) What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?

Basically, we are considered a Detroit Michigan Christian progressive rock band and have been since we started this journey.

3.) FROM YOUR POINT OF VIEW, WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN BEING AN ARTIST AND ENTREPRENEUR?

Interesting question. I would say that an artist is a creative that generates their ideas and passions into personal visions aimed at the more esoteric areas of life and that may or may not generate tangible results to anyone outside of themselves (but I know they certainly hope it will) while an entrepreneur is a creative whose goal would be to create a tangible, flourishing and definable result and basically aimed at the business world. Not many bands can claim that we're thinking.

We got together right out of high school (and actually Bill and Steve played together during high school!). To this day we get together every week to rehearse, record and just enjoy each other's company. Does it get old 5 decades later? Absolutely not! We just get better with age.

5.) WHAT MADE YOU WANT TO PURSUE YOUR ART OR TALENT AS A CAREER CHOICE?

We started out totally influenced by the progressive rock English music scene of the 60's and 70's: bands like Pink Floyd, Yes, Genesis, Atomic Rooster, Uriah Heep all left their musical marks on our writing and playing. In the 70's, we started listening to a lot of American bands like Kansas, Journey, Rush and Spock's Beard to keep our creative juices flowing.

In the beginning, we opened up for such classic rock acts as Bob Seger, Foghat, Nazareth, Steppenwolf and many more before finding our true path into the Christian music field. As we hit our Golden Jubilee (50 years of SWEET CRYSTAL!), we realize we are just as tough and enduring as Detroit – a city that's been up, then down and now rising up again!

Wow... for me (Q) it would be Keith Emerson, the legendary keyboardist of Emerson, Lake and Palmer. Also producer extraordinaire Alan Parsons for his huge catalog of work. I will be transferring to Howard University in the near future.

5.) What made you want to pursue your art or talent as a career choice?

I desired studying in both music, psychology, and neuroscience originally. I had been through the ropes of mental hospitals, formally known as psych wards. I've met several music therapists in the past and learned their personal experiences as a musicians and how they got into music therapy.

7. What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?



Neurilemma is a very Soothing Start up with a smooth transition once the beat drops .


