So, I end up working jobs I don't want to do which takes time away from what I want to do as a photographer.

3. What made you interested in photography as your desired skill?

I've always loved taking pictures when I was a kid and so when I showed interests in cameras I received 1 for graduation by my mom & haven't put it down permanently yet. It's like holding on to the great time that was had at that moment and being able to relive it not only in the mind but heart & soul as well.

4. As a Photographer & Content Creator, who or what inspires your vision?

I mean, honestly, I've never paid much attention to who was taking the pictures, I just loved the pictures. Sure, Gordon Parks is known & even Andy Warhol's photos I love more than his paintings but they weren't who inspired me .. it was always the people in the pictures that I was inspired by & who helps to plan my vision.



I think of how I can bring to life the person in the picture and just go from there. Or if I have a product to promote I think of the best way to be creative but also push the product. Also, spending time with like minded individuals always always helps free my creativity.

5. What keeps you motivated & inspired while achieving your goals?

Being bored frankly, I can't stand not having anything to do so I go out and find something to do. When I was younger it was walking thru the woods, or going to another neighborhood and seeing what all the fuss was about, usually the same ol ignorant things.

After I got a camera in my hand it turned into museum tours, jazz parties, night club scenes, outdoor play and fun, bar mixers and wild animals. I said all that to say, life in its totality, is what motivates me & keeps me going.

6. What has been the most impactful experience of your career so far?

Oh man lol I'd say stepping out in front of other people's cameras. I've been able to meet celebrities and politicians of all sorts from behind the camera and that has been amazing! However, I grew more into who I am once I stopped being shy of my abilities and finally did something I've always wanted to do and that was modeling. Such a freeing moment for me and helped me see the perspective from the other side of the lens. It's been a lot easier for me to conduct a photoshoot other than just telling the model to move around and keep your chin tucked in.


4.) What year did you start?




6.) What are your top five artists or idols inspiration?



Art has always felt like a calling for me, I don't know if it was ever a choice but more so something that I needed to do. I started out as a contemporary dancer and then focused more intently on music after an injury, in between I've dabbled in many art forms because they bring me so much joy!

7.) What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?



1.) Where are you from?

I am from Funkstown Maryland.

2.) What inspires your view of art?

Inspiration can hit in so many different ways. Every song is always different and lives its own unique life. Most consistently, mine will begin with a situation in my life that angers me or makes me upset in some way, and I journal about it in a notebook. It's not pretty, not poetic, not a song yet, but then I can go back and pull individual lines out of it, or a few words will happen to rhyme. From there, the lyrics are like puzzle pieces.

My view of art is that it should never be filtered, because one's pain, authenticity, and honesty can make someone else feel heard. For my birthday this year, I got a tattoo on my arm that says, "If people wanted you to write warmly about them, they should've behaved better", and I live by that.

3.) From your point of view, what is the difference between being an artist and entrepreneur?

From what I've gathered, to be a successful musician, artistry and entrepreneurship will often overlap. A great artist does not only write compelling songs but can create imagery surrounding their music. Visually conceptualizing an album or project is vital to helping it resonate with an audience, which ties into marketing.

Plus, for an artist to grow a platform (and get gigs), they must network. Being an independent musician is a lot like running a business, except you are your own boss. The music/songwriting is the foundation, while the marketing, branding, and entrepreneurial aspects are what can push one's work out to the masses.

4.) What year did you start?

My parents tell me I have been singing and coming up with songs since I could speak. My piano journey, however, is a little all over the place. My mom taught piano lessons out of our house growing up and I always had an understanding of the basics, but really dove in on learning covers and writing my first "real" songs in middle school.


By eighth grade, my choir teacher heard one of those originals and encouraged me to perform it (sort of by throwing me onstage and seeing how I reacted). I am so grateful for that experience, it entirely changed my life. He taught me piano for the next year until COVID hit, and then I began gigging on my own when I was fifteen.

5.) What made you want to pursue your art or talent as a career choice?

What made you want to pursue your art or talent as a career choice? I have always been drawn towards the stage. I grew up studying ballet and performing in musicals, but the piano always felt like my safe space at the end of the day. Songwriting is a form of therapy for me, and I wouldn't be here without it. I write because I need to, and I am eternally grateful that my songs resonate with others. I don't know what else I would do as a career choice. Music is simply what I live for.

6.) What are your top five artists or idols inspiration?

My biggest songwriting inspiration is Fiona Apple. I admire her portrayal of pure angst, the roughness of her voice, and the way she plays the piano so percussively. "When The Pawn" is my absolute favorite album of all time. In terms of image, I owe a lot to Lana Del Rey. The way she uses character voices in her earlier songs like "Off To The Races" and "Diet Mountain Dew" enticed me originally, and I've grown to become a huge fan of her albums *NFR* and *Ultraviolence*. She created an aesthetic and brought it to life, not only with her voice but with her persona as a whole.



Vocally, I draw a lot from the raw emotion that Amy Winehouse put into her live performances. I constantly have her "Live At BBC" album playing, and I adore the soulfulness of her voice in songs such as "What It Is" and "Take The Box".

Similarly, I have been getting into Raye. Her debut album changed my life, and her Tiny Desk performance is one of my favorite things to listen to while I get ready for my own gigs, as I hope to one day emulate her scatting and belting ability. Lastly, listening to Lizzy Mcalpine has been very helpful for me lyrically, as her songs showcase such vulnerability and honesty.

7.) What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?


To young performers, practice practice practice! Take every opportunity you can to put yourself in front of an audience. Onstage, breathe deeply, remind yourself that you are prepared and that you are in control. Stage fright and nerves are natural, but performing gets easier the more you do it. I make mistakes at every show, I have a million lessons to learn, and that is the beauty of it.

And to everyone else, if you have a creative outlet, use it! Tell your stories with no shame or hesitation, because they belong to you.

1.J Where are you from?

I live in Los Angeles. But, I was born in Dar es Salaam, Tanzania, did my early school years in Uganda, lived in Iowa as an exchange student, and traveled to a few countries in South Asia and Europe before settling in Los Angeles.

2.J What inspires your view of art?

What inspires my view of art is deeply rooted in my upbringing and the central role music played in my life. Growing up, my home was filled with music from morning to night, thanks to our extensive collection of vinyl records, CDs, and cassettes. We had a music system with a vinyl record player, a multi-CD player, and a cassette player connected to eight speakers, which ensured that the sounds resonated throughout the entire house.

My mom had a deep love for artists like Diana Ross, Whitney Houston, Mariah Carey, Stevie Wonder, Luther Vandross, Celine Dion, Tina Turner, Michael Bolton, Phil Collins, and Don Williams - to name a few. Each of these artists brought a different flavor to our home, from the soulful melodies of Stevie Wonder to the powerful vocals of Whitney Houston and the timeless tunes of Phil Collins.

On the other hand, my dad's musical preferences included legends such as Louis Armstrong, Frank Sinatra, ABBA, Beethoven, Mozart, and Yvonne Chaka Chaka - to name a few. The contrast between my mom's and dad's music choices created a rich, diverse soundscape. 1.) Where are you from?

I am from Taipei, Taiwan, a rainy city rich in arts and culture. Every year, many domestic and international musicians hold concerts or perform at music festivals in Taipei. In such an environment, I naturally integrated music into my life. Music clubs in Taipei schools are also thriving, and you can always find like-minded music enthusiasts in some corner of the campus. I learned piano as a child but didn't practice diligently and wasn't very interested in the monotonous classical piano. Before high school, I primarily listened to Mandarin and Western pop music and was unaware of the existence of rock music. During middle school, I was passionate about playing baseball. On one occasion, a teammate missed a baseball game because he had a guitar lesson. At the time, I thought he was quite odd for choosing to play the guitar over baseball. When it came time to choose clubs in high school, I suddenly remembered the boy who skipped baseball to play the guitar and casually decided to join the guitar club on a whim, "Why not guitar?". This choice led me to forge an inseparable bond with the guitar and introduced me to the charm of rock music for the first time. I think my musical journey truly began in high school. I don't know how my life would have turned out if I hadn't met that guitar-playing boy who skipped the baseball game. Only God can answer that question.



2.) What inspires your view of art?

My musical inspiration comes from several aspects. The first is the hardcore spirit of hard rock.

The explosive power of rock music radiates intense vitality, making me want to convey the energy and passion of life contained in the universe through music. Rock music allows you to release the immense energy hidden within your body. The second is the subtlety and unconventional nature of British rock. The arrangements and emotional expressions of British rock are not as direct as American rock, but its creativity opens up a new world of music. In an era dominated by electronic music, the sound of the guitar feels more human. The non-rigid and often surprising playing style of British rock makes me feel that music is a living organism, not a mechanical product. The third is the melodiousness of pop music. Many rock fans don't particularly like pop music, but classic pop songs that can be passed down through generations all have memorable melodies. Therefore, I believe a good song must attract non-music professionals to be considered successful. After all, musicians often tend to showcase their technical skills and get lost in the music. A technically skilled musician may impress you, but a true musician will make you naturally enjoy the music. Hence, I believe musicians must learn to be humble towards non-musicians, as their perception of music is often the most genuine and objective. The fourth is rhythm. It is said that a band's style is determined by the drummer, and I agree with this statement. Without a good rhythm as the foundation of a song, the song won't be as captivating. I also learned jazz drums for a year. Although I later focused on the guitar and didn't continue with the drums, this process made me imagine what it feels like to play the drums when listening to or creating music. It also enabled me to discuss drum arrangements with drummers.

3.) From your point of view, what is the difference between being an artist and entrepreneur?

Entrepreneurs aim to create consumer demand, so no matter how creative the prototype concept is, it ultimately has to be tested in the market to confirm whether the product can meet consumer needs.

In contrast, artists focus on expressing their inner universe, conveying their aesthetic beliefs without concern for external opinions. If one simply caters to external preferences and forgets who they really are, I don't consider them an artist but rather a craftsman. An artist does not let external criticism affect their artistic motivation. They can accept technical advice from critics, but they won't shy away from expressing themselves just because they are not critically acclaimed. They see the beauty they create as a unique part of the universe and create art to leave a trace of their existence, not to gain anyone's approval. Of course, an excellent artist also possesses qualities similar to an entrepreneur. They are not content with mediocrity, they seek to create uniqueness, and they pursue excellence. However, an artist is fulfilled at the moment that they complete a work they are satisfied with, whereas an entrepreneur must gain market recognition to be considered successful. This, in my view, is the primary difference between the two.

Modern musicians are also required to have business acumen and marketing creativity, which I think is a good thing. Musicians need to engage with the world to gain more attention, but for me, music creation remains a sacred and inviolable realm. Even if I cannot achieve what is generally considered success, it is not that important to me.

4.) What year did you start?

In 2023, I released my first single, '紫紅色玫瑰' (Purple Red Rose). I had completed the melody a long time ago, but I couldn't figure out the ending, so I put the song aside. One ordinary night while commuting, I was riding my scooter and listening to the song. Suddenly I effortlessly finished playing the outro guitar, in my mind. From that moment on, I told myself that I had to finish recording this song; I would regret it for the rest of my life if I didn't complete the recording.

When I went online, I discovered that it's now possible for one person to release music independently nowadays. So, I started setting up a humble recording studio in my room. I asked Jeff, a drummer I used to play music with, to help me arrange the drums and organ using a mouse. After finishing the recording and mixing of the entire song, I felt no regrets in my life as I listened to my song on my smartphone. On the release day, September 14, 2023, I played my music on a streaming platform and couldn't help but shed tears. In the future, I will continue to complete and release my unpublished works at my own pace.

5.) What made you want to pursue your art or talent as a career choice?

Whenever I complete a piece of music that I am satisfied with, there is always a voice inside me saying, 'You have a responsibility to finish this song.' Although I naturally see myself as a 'discoverer' of the music created by God rather than its 'creator,' I always find my unique existence through my love for melodies, singing, instruments playing, and lyrics writing, which makes me feel truly alive. Therefore, for me, creating music is as natural as breathing. It is a way to discover my life through music and to prove God's presence in my heart. To me, my songs are like my babies. I feel a responsibility to take good care of them and help them grow up smoothly. In other words, creating music is not a choice but a responsibility for me. To achieve my subjective aesthetic standards, I cannot compromise with other musicians or listeners. I admit my subjectivity and limitations and often record hundreds of takes for a single passage without necessarily succeeding, because only I know what constitutes perfection. As long as I am the very first audience of my song, that alone justifies my music creation. Does this answer seem too willful?

6.) What are your top five artists or idols inspiration?

1. Radiohead - They achieve a perfect balance between avant-garde guitar playing and the accessibility of music, with surprising guitar performances and creative usage of effect pedals in rock music.
2. Antonio Carlos Jobim - Classic song melodies that you won't forget, perfectly matched with personality-filled Latin rhythms, creating a seamless blend.
3. My Bloody Valentine - I greatly admire Kevin Shields' syncopated rhythm guitar playing. He showcases the strength and power of an electric guitarist with Fender guitars. One of my guitar hero.
4. Stevie Wonder - Masterful in both composition and melody, he embodies the ideal image of a singer-songwriter in my mind.
5. Nakata Yasutaka - Despite working in electronic music production, his music makes me feel the same creativity and immense energy as rock music.

7.) What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?

Firstly, listen to music extensively and build up your own music library. Through rearranging melodies and rhythms from your library, your music will become more rich and diverse. Secondly, find music enthusiasts with similar tastes to play music together. No matter how talented you are, time is limited, and you cannot master all instruments or understand all music techniques in your lifetime. If someone else can do something you can't and you are satisfied with their work, let them do it! Thirdly, create sincere music. Speak your mind, create your own sound, and don't just settle for fitting into music formulas. Have your own set of standards, eliminate music you feel isn't good, and keep what you think is good. In other words, play music, don't let music play you. Fourthly, record and publish all the music compositions you are satisfied with. Perhaps after a few years, you may want to re-record it, set it unlisted, or even delete it, but when you listen to this piece of music, you will remember the time when you lived earnestly. Lastly, don't pay too much attention to external comments. Brave enough to show and express yourself, always be proud to be the first listener of your music. Your music is your baby; it doesn't matter if others don't like it as long as you love it.

- Britney Spears - she is a multi-talented artist not only does she sings great but also dance well.


7.) What advice would you recommend to young viewers watching?
